WHAT IS IT?

The Restore Hibiscus & Bays Volunteer Initiatives Programme (VIP) aims to provide funding to our network of groups, neighbourhoods, schools, and other individuals to carry out short-term projects to eradicate pests, restore native habitats and improve water quality across public and private land in the Hibiscus & Bays Local Board area.

HOW IT WORKS?

Communities can apply for funding up to around \$3,000 for a project that they have identified as important to the conservation and restoration of native biodiversity in their area. Projects may be small (e.g. one event) or more extensive (e.g. a series of activities). They may be completely independent of projects initiated by Auckland Council, or they may complement such work.

PROJECT CRITERIA

- NOT EASILY FUNDED ELSEWHERE A PROJECT (OR PART OF A PROJECT) THAT IS NOT CURRENTLY ADDRESSED BY AUCKLAND COUNCIL, ONE OF THEIR CONTRACTORS OR ANOTHER FUNDING AGENCY
- LOCAL COMMUNITY, NEIGHBOURHOOD OR RESERVE-BASED
- HAS THE POTENTIAL TO ENHANCE AND SUSTAIN
 CAPACITY AND CAPABILITY
- PAVES THE WAY FOR LONG TERM COMMUNITY AND ENVIRONMENTAL BENEFITS
- SUPPORTS THE GATHERING OF INFORMATION TO MONITOR THE ONGOING SUCCESS OF THE WORK UNDERTAKEN
- ONE-OFF OR A SHORT TERM INITIATIVE COMPLETED OVER A DEFINED PERIOD

VIP projects will integrate with work done by the Auckland Council Parks
Department, Pest Free Auckland, Council contractors and other agencies. The
Restore Hibiscus & Bays team will advise you if parts of a project can be covered by an alternative funding source, such as the Parks Volunteer Ranger or Council contractors. Physical tools for restoration and conservation projects can often be accessed through our community tool library or directly supplied through Auckland Council. TERMS AND CONDITIONS

- Support and funding will only be provided to those projects that have been approved by the Restore Hibiscus & Bays VIP Review Panel and our Steering Group.
- A progress report is required at completion of all paid works, including before and after photos or other digital media (such as a short video) that can be shared on Restore Hibiscus & Bays social media, web pages, newsletters or in reports to funding agencies. More frequent updates are appreciated.
- Records of events held, number of volunteers involved, volunteer hours worked must be submitted to Restore Hibiscus & Bays.
- The contribution of Restore Hibiscus & Bays, the Hibiscus & Bays Local Board and Auckland Council must be acknowledged in all publicity and signage.
